For that reason, you need to prepare several things before you fly to Bali. In this guide, we will show you all of the requirements you need to fulfill to visit The Island of Gods.

Wholeheartedly committed to take care of its visitors' well-being, Bali is ready to welcome you with 3 utmost efforts, namely, by maintaining its status as one of the provinces in Indonesia with the highest vaccination rate, the highest CHSE (Cleanliness, Health, Safety & Environmental Sustainability) certifications, as well as one of the provinces that provides safety protocols for all visitors.

CHSE Certification

To assure your safety, health, hygiene, and comfort, the Ministry of Tourism and Creative Economy has introduced a CHSE certification, which stands for Cleanliness, Health, Safety, and Environmental sustainability. This certification is given to tourism businesses across Indonesia which have been proven to implement cleanliness, health, safety, and environmental sustainability protocols as their first and foremost priority.

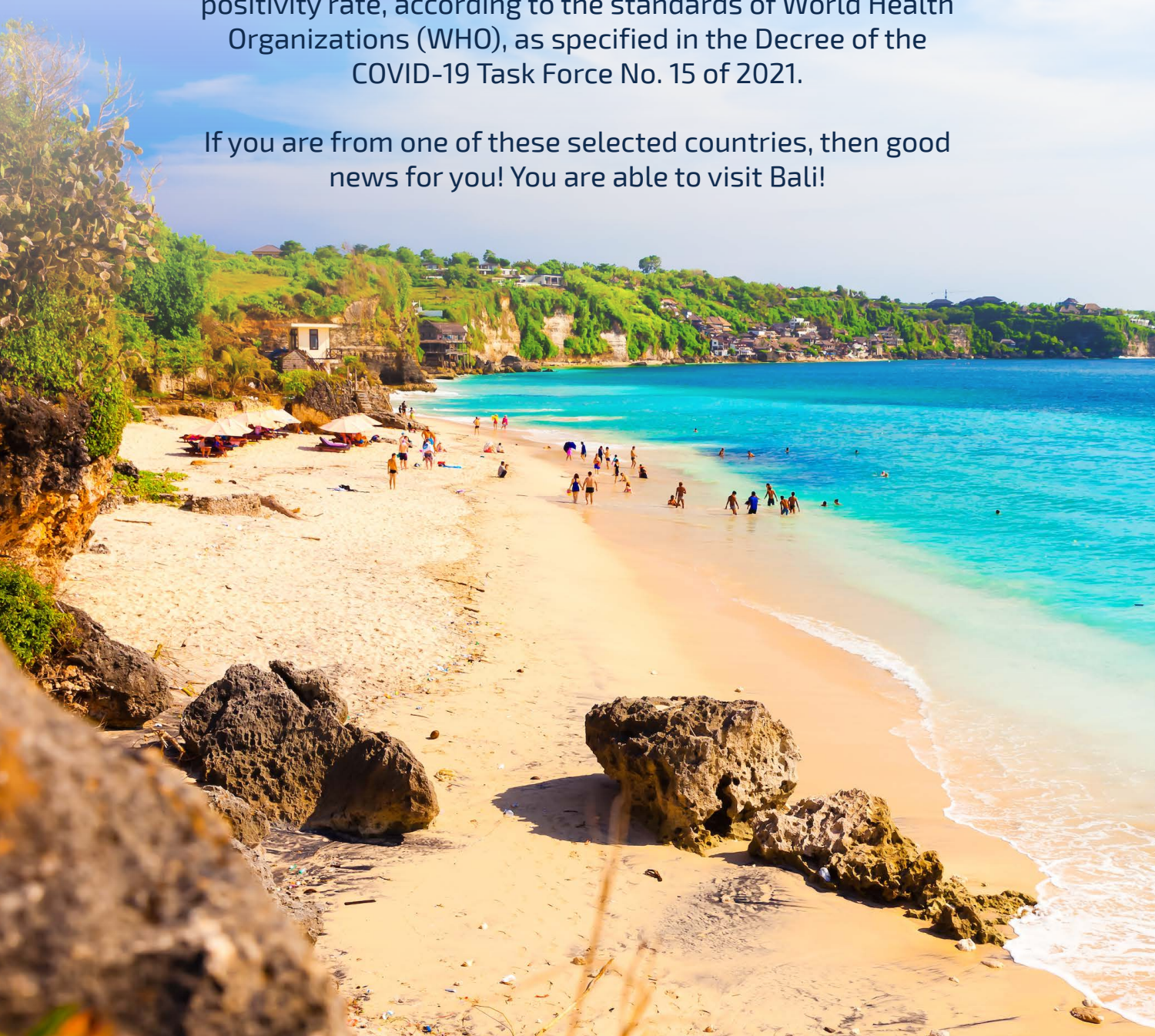


COUNTRIES ELIGIBLE TO ENTER BALI

PRE-DEPARTURE PREPARATION REGARDING VISAS

Before departing to Bali, you also need to prepare yourself with the latest information about the visa and requirements to enter Indonesia. Below are the two types of visas you can currently apply to enter Indonesia:

+ Pre Flight

- Provide a full-dose vaccination certificate at least 14 days before arrival (make sure your vaccination data has been verified beforehand by Indonesia's Ministry of Health)
- Download PeduliLindungi application (A mobile app created for contact tracing purposes, which also serves to store your digital COVID-19 vaccination certificates and COVID-19 test results)
- Register e-PCR
- Verify your e-HAC (A health alert identification for screening and monitoring purposes)
- Register e-CD (Electronic Custom Declaration)
- Provide the proof of your hotel booking for travel adjustment period
- Prepare negative PCR result (3x24 hours before arrival)
- Prepare immigration documents
- Prepare travel insurance
- Remember to wear your mask during the flight

Landing in Bali

Make sure that you have prepared all of the pre-arrival requirements. Remember to also wear your mask and practice physical distancing regularly



Health Document Check

- PeduliLindungi and e-HAC
- Complete vaccination document
- Negative PCR test results valid for 3x24 hours



Thermo Scanner

- For body temperature below 38°C, proceed to the next step
- For body temperature exceeding 38°C, a further medical examination will be done immediately. If all health requirements are good, proceed to the next step. If not, travelers will be referred to the nearest hospital



Take an RT-PCR test

and then wait for your test result in the holding area.

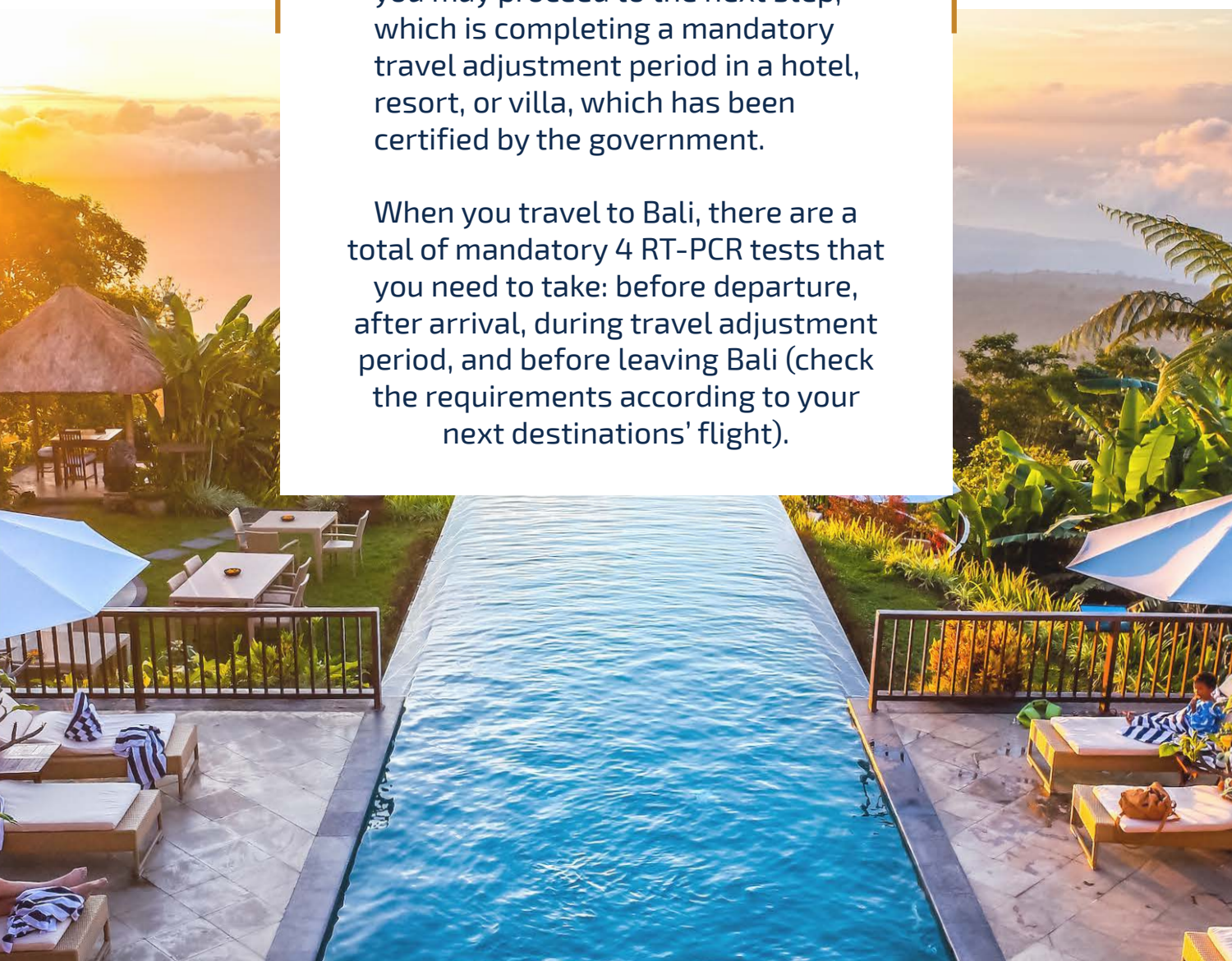




Below are the flow you have to take after receiving your RT-PCR test result:

- If your RT-PCR result is positive, then you will have to undergo either:
 - + Treatment in centralized isolation facilities (if you are asymptomatic or show mild symptoms); or
 - + Treatment at the nearby referral hospital available in Bali (if you show moderate or severe symptoms).
- If your RT-PCR result is negative, then you may proceed to the next step, which is completing a mandatory travel adjustment period in a hotel, resort, or villa, which has been certified by the government.

When you travel to Bali, there are a total of mandatory 4 RT-PCR tests that you need to take: before departure, after arrival, during travel adjustment period, and before leaving Bali (check the requirements according to your next destinations' flight).

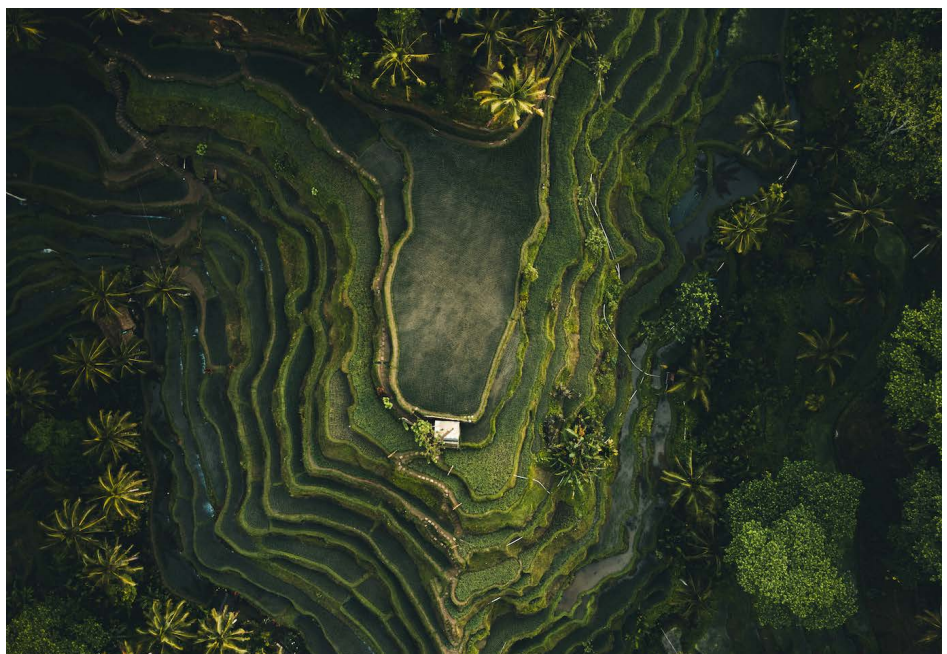


Ubud Monkey Forest
