The Manggarai area is also famous for its unique coffee beans. You may find lots of shops that sell ready-to-go coffee powders, both robusta and arabica. The best coffee powders would be the Spice Tubruk Coffee, the original Manggarai beans, the Arabica Manggarai powder, and the Robusta Manggarai powder.

The Caci Dance

The Caci Dance is a captivating traditional dance from the indigenous Manggarai people of Labuan Bajo. Songke

The Songke motifs are a prominent feature in the craftsmanship of Labuan Bajo, particularly in the weaving tradition of the Manggarai people. These motifs are intricate and geometric patterns that are skillfully incorporated into various woven textiles, such as traditional garments, blankets, and ceremonial fabrics. The Songke motifs are meticulously woven by hand using backstrap looms, with each design carrying deep cultural and symbolic meanings.

If any of you want to bring souvenirs after returning from Labuan Bajo, there are several unique souvenirs that you can't miss, one of which is the typical Tanah Manggarai songke cloth. This cloth is generally black in colour with a variety of colourful motifs on it. As with other Indonesian fabrics, songke motifs are very diverse and have their own meanings!

Wae Rebo

Village

The traditional village of Wae Rebo is a small and isolated village in the Island of Flores. The village was founded around 100 years ago by their ancestor Empu Maro. Today, the locals of this village are the 18th generation of Empu Maro's descendants. It's located about 4-5 hours ny foot from Denge, and completely surrounded by mountains and the trees of the Todo forest. Rich in vegetation, you'll find many orchids and types of ferns as you hear the acoustics of nature. While the air in the village might be crisp and cool, the people of Wae Rebo give a warm welcome to their You each time

You may find their unique communal houses. Called Mbaru Niang, it has a tall structure and conical shape. Most of the building is its roof, made by lontar thatch in its entirety. The house has five levels that have different functions. The first level is called Lutur are the living quarters of the families; the second level called Lobo stores food and goods; the third level called Lentar is to store seedlings for their next harvest; the fourth level is called Lempa Rae and stores food stocks; while the fifth level called Hekang Kode is the sacred place, a floor to place offerings for their ancestors.

Wae Rebo is rich in both cultural heritage and natural beauty. It was known for its efforts in sustaining its traditions and since has grown as the people's choice of ecotourism destination. It's a beautiful sight to see, and an unforgettable experience all around.
